The 4 Types of Love in the Bible

"The Bible says that God is love and that humans crave love from the moment of existence. But the word love describes an emotion with vastly differing degrees of intensity."

Eros "(Pronounced: AIR-ohs) is the Greek word for sensual or romantic love." **Storge** "(Pronounced: STOR-jay) is a term for love in the Bible that you may not be familiar with. This Greek word describes family love, the affectionate bond that develops naturally between parents and children, and brothers and sisters." **Philia** "(Pronounced: FILL-ee-uh) is the type of intimate love in the Bible that most Christians practice toward each other. This Greek term describes the powerful emotional bond seen in deep friendships." **Agape** "(Pronounced: Uh-GAH-pay) is the highest of the four types of love in the Bible. This term defines God's immeasurable, incomparable love for humankind. It is the divine love that comes from God. Agape love is perfect, unconditional, sacrificial, and pure."

Charity (or love) is defined in the Catechism of the Catholic Church as, "The theological virtue by which we love God above all things for his own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God." (CCC 1822) St. Paul tells us that love (charity) is the greatest of the theological virtues: "So faith, hope, love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love" (1 Cor. 13:13).

The Catholic theological virtue of "love" is actually called charity because it has a more nuanced meaning in the Scriptures than does love. It defines charity as means participating in tangible acts of loving-kindness toward all others (friend or enemy) in unconditional and self-sacrificial ways. Love (charity) may need to suffer or face things it does not prefer, but it does rejoice in the truth to the benefit of others.

Charity, the form of all the virtues, "binds everything together in perfect harmony" (Col 3:14) (RSVCE).
